The Principal Leadership Institute (PLI) provides preparation for reform-oriented candidates who are ready, willing and interested in achieving equitable educational outcomes for all students. In 14 months, candidates earn a Masters of Arts in Education as well as the Preliminary Administrative Services Credential. Active, rigorous and relevant instruction are hallmarks of the program.

### Admission requirements include:

- Passing score on California Basic Education Skills Test (CBEST)
- Current valid California clear or life teaching or services prerequisite credential
- At least five years of full-time classroom teaching or pupil personnel services experience
- High quality teaching experience (recent 10-20 minute video with accompanying lesson plan)
